## WHAT IS THE PRE-OPENING?

The pre-opening activities should be set up <u>well in advance</u> of the meeting time so that early arrivals will have some constructive, challenging and fun activities to do while the remainder of the Scouts arrive prior to the start of the meeting. These types of activities can be done no matter what time the Scouts arrive. The activities should cease as soon the meeting is ready to be started.

## AN EXAMPLE OF A PRE-OPENING:

Fill a table with various merit badges and have the scouts try to guess their names. This could be done by
obtaining a copy of the poster which has all the merit badges and by cutting out each one, leaving off the name,
or covering up the names with masking tape, or using merit badges from our resource room. Have the Scouts
number their page from 1 to 120 and see how many merit badges they can name. (Give a prize at the end of the
meeting to the Scout who named the most merit badges)
