SUMMER CAMP 9 - 15 July

## What You Should Take to Summer Camp

Sleeping Bag, or wool or cotton blanket
Sheet and pillow
 Air mattress or twin mattress cover (suggested but not necessary)
 Scout Uniform (wear it there and supper and other special times)
Coat hanger to Hang it up
extra uniform shirt if have one
 Shoes (regular and sneakers) Bring boots if have them
 Rain gear (It is summer - it will rain)
 Jacket - all around light weight, nights could be cool and damp
 Blue jeans or extra old pants (needed for lifesaving merit badge)
(Also long sleeve shirt needed for life saving merit badge)
 Swimming suit (sturdy pair)
 Cut-offs or shorts
 Shirts, T-shirts or regular everyday shirts (no inappropriate themes, slogans or pictures)
 Briefs
 Hankerchiefs (old)
 sleepwear
 Socks (and extra pair)
 Towels (2) - one for swim and one for shower
 Toiletry kit - soap, shampoo, comb, toothbrush, deodorant, toothpaste
 Clothes bag - for dirty clothes (mesh type bag works best for damp clothes)
 Knife, fork, spoon, cup, and plate (a bowl would help you eat if the bears treat)
 Bug Repellent (2 cans) BUGS THINK SCOUTS ARE TASTY
 Flashlight with extra batteries
 Ditty Bag or small day/back pack (for junk) pocket knife, pencil, paper, pad, compass, camera
 Money –for merit badge supplies (basketry, leatherwork, photography, etc Also for the trading post (as much as you can afford to lose)
ONE (1) very old T-shirt (for camp service project)
Scout Handbook
 Merit Badge Pamphlets for the merit badges you will be taking
 Survival Kit
 Stave
 LONG PANTS - you need a pair

LABEL ALL Items

or else lost items end up with the Quartermaster and his store is already full of your stuff

Packing Tip - Place each days clothes in an extra large clear plastic ziplock, keeps stuff dry, organized and easy to find! Label each day, and place extra clothes in an extra labeled ziplock baggie.

Extra Key or combination for your footlocker to give to Scoutmaster. His master key removes the lock AND the lock loops......

# **\*\* More Important Information\*\***

Proper equipment can mean the difference between HAVING FUN while you are at summer camp or being downright miserable! Here is our suggested list of necessary equipment. Double check this list carefully. Ask your Scoutmaster or patrol leader for further suggestions and add a few items of your own (NOT TOO MANY) as you will be sharing tent space with another scout in your patrol. MAKE SURE EACH AND EVERY ITEM IS <u>LABELED</u> WITH YOUR NAME !!!!

#### WHILE AT CAMP -----

- 1. Air bedding daily. It will feel more comfortable and SMELL better.
- 2. Always store your clean clothes and personal belongings inside a duffle bag, suitcase, or footlocker. Dirty clothes go in a separate mesh (ventilated) bag.
- 3. Don't hang clothes form the tie-bands in your tent. String a line between the tent poles. Bring hangers and hang shirts, trousers, etc. from there.
- 4. NEVER leave valuables out in plain sight. Keep them locked up OR leave them at home. They may get STOLEN.
- 5. Your cot will break if you treat it in a rough manner. Never use it for a seat or have more than one person on it at a time.
- 6. Keep your tent and the area around it clean. Never dig ditches around your tent, EVER.
- 7. Never use a candle, lantern, or a flame inside or near a tent. Do NOT use matches in a tent.
